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Basics of teaching Arabic to non-native speakers

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Abstract

The study focused on revealing the foundations of teaching Arabic to non-native speakers in order to facilitate the learners' task and find the best methods that help achieve their purposes, whether they are private or public purposes. The study aimed to teach the Arabic language correctly, spread it among non-native speakers, teach language skills in a clear and integrated manner, choose appropriate teaching methods, find the most effective ways to communicate the Arabic language to the whole world, and preserve the sounds of the Arabic language as they are. The researcher followed the descriptive-analytical approach, which is concerned with human studies.
